Taalib Henderson, resident, questioned the survival rate in Lindenwold. Mayor stated that the reports state statistics for number of deaths. The CDC reports the overall survival rate at approximately 90%. The Mayor also advised that the statistics are available on the Camden County website.

There being no one else desiring the floor, the Mayor closed the meeting to the public.
